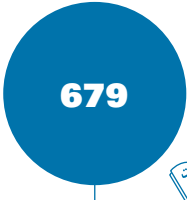

Ummah Children Academy, Nowshera

For allowing the orphans from impoverished families to unlock their future by getting access to free-of-cost and quality education, Ummah Children Academy, a state-of-the-art educational facility was established in the year 2007 by Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak).

Located at main G.T road, Soria Khel, Nowshera, the academy is a flagship educational project of the charity where enrolled orphan students from all over Pakistan have access to free-of-cost quality-education (Modern | Islamic), boarding, food, medical-care and recreational services.

139 orphan students have graduated from the academy who are now completing their higher education (Medical, Engineering, LAW, Information Technologies, Business Administration etc.) in some of the renowned universities of Pakistan.

Education is not easily accessible even for the children from affluent families in hard-to-reach and least developed parts of the country but to allow even the disadvantaged orphan students of South Waziristan, Ummah Children Academy at Wana was operationalized by Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) in 2010 where the academy at present cater the educational needs of more than 580 orphan students.

At Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak), we believe in the true transformative power of quality education where technical education can bring positive changes in the youth employability ultimately helping them to improve their livelihoods opportunities for bringing changes in their personal, their families and even overall socio-economic condition of the community.

To meet the full range needs of technical education of orphan students, Ummah College of Technology was established in 2015 where the college is currently offering various technologies courses (Diploma of Associate Engineering) including civil, electrical, mechanical and petroleum along with short courses surveying, draftsman and CAD, electrician and carpentry etc. as well as one-year diploma in Information Technology.

The solutions-oriented initiative is targeting vocational training as per the existing market demand as the students enrolled at the technical education facility are effectively upgrading their skill-sets for a better future.



THE DISRUPTED CHILDHOOD

Parents in Pakistan (the world's 5th most populous country), find it always a monumental challenge to educate their children where in case of a child with special needs, the load is doubled both emotionally and financially.

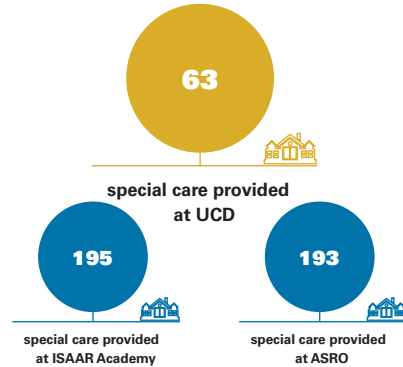
These challenging experiences are happening in every country across the world but some of the most privileged children and their parents have been able to cope with the challenges, but not the majority.

With their birth, their special needs mark a dramatically different childhood experience for these young children who will have to live for the rest of their lives what they are lacking or otherwise they had to rapidly adapt, be creative and learn to excel in the society.

These children with special needs have more potential of having positive impacts and better economic prospects as compared to the normal children but only need a way out from the situation they are living.

Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak), from the very start, been working to support children with special needs by allowing them to access free-of-cost and specially designed educational and rehabilitation services in form of **Ummah Center for the Disabled**.

195 children with special needs at ISAAR Academy, Gujrat and 193 Students at ASRO, Lower Dir are allowed to have access to educational (Modern | Islamic) and rehabilitation services to achieve their full potential.

Housing has always been a matter of life and death as having a home is central for shelter against rain, storm, cold, or heat.

It is also the first line of defense against extreme events and crises such as earthquake, floods, snowstorms, conflicts and emergencies.

Homes are essential for accessing job opportunities, hospitals, schools, food, sanitation, transportation, and other public services.

Availability of safe housing with adequate space is not only a human right on its own, but also a precondition for the enjoyment of many other fundamental rights, human dignity, and overall well-being.

Estimated 100 million people were homeless worldwide where as many as 1.6 billion people lacked adequate housing as per UN-Habitat-2015 report.

It is estimated that 20 million people lacking adequate housing in Pakistan with the majority living in slums and other forms of temporary housing.

Alhamdulillah, UWT (Pak) had built houses with adequate living space having all the required accommodation facilities for the shelter-less and economically disadvantaged families across the districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province of Pakistan.



PROTECTING THE FUTURE

Orphan Sponsorship

'Have you seen him who denies the (Day of) Judgment? That is the one who repels the orphan and does not encourage feeding the poor.' [Q 107:1-3]

After losing his/her father, the widowed mother of an orphan child bear the brunt of disproportionate care burdens with disruptions in income which ultimately compromise her children access to education, poor availability of health-care services and other essential services.

For orphans and their widowed mothers already living in crushing poverty, these impacts can be a shock to their economic stability overall and impede their ability to purchase critical necessities, such as medicine and food.

Children in developing countries like Pakistan been mostly orphaned by natural disasters and conflicts as they are the least likely to fully experience childhood, a time that should be dedicated to their emotional, social and physical development, as well as play.

To provide the required assistance to the disadvantaged orphaned children dreaming for a brighter future, Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) Orphans Sponsorship project (up to the age of 16 years) is delivering required financial assistance to the sponsored orphans of Pakistan providing them better opportunities through vital cash-based support (£25 per month) for their educational expenses, regardless of their status and gender.



PROTECTION WITH DIGNITY

Widows Sponsorship

Abdullah bin Abbaas Radiyallahu 'anhu said:

'For me to fulfil the necessities of a Muslim family for a month or for a week or for whatever period of time that Allah pleases, is more beloved to me than performing Hajj after Hajj. Buying a utensil for even a Daaniq (one-sixth of a dirham) and giving it to my brother as a gift for the pleasure of Allah is more beloved to me than spending a Dinaar in the path of Allah.' [Abu Nu'aym]

Husband's death always suggests an inequality catastrophe in the making possessing an even higher risk for widows and their families from poor backgrounds in the 3rd world countries like Pakistan.

Inside the patriarchal society, widowhood, is not only a sorrowful event for a woman but a disempowering one, leading to social and economic marginalization with more responsibilities, less power, and increased vulnerabilities.

To support the disempowered widows having more responsibilities on their shoulders with less resources, **Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak)** is implementing Widows Sponsorship project allowing widows in **Pakistan** to address their economic hardships effectively with utmost dignity.

Each sponsored widow, receives **£30** per month as financial assistance to cover basic essentials of her family.



IN THE HOUSE OF ALLAH

Masjid Construction

There is a great reward in building a masjid for Allah's sake. The Prophet (SAW) said: "Whoever builds a masjid for Allah, Allah will build for him likewise in Paradise."
[Sahih al-Bukhari and Sahih Muslim]

The masjid is the heart of any Muslim community anywhere in the world as it ensures that the worship of Allah (S.W.T) is established, his negligence is removed, and the education of a community (children as well as elders) takes place.

The role of the Masjid in society has always been instrumental in regards to social, moral and educational uplifting of the Muslim community.

To help promote piety and righteousness amongst the believers, Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) has regularly built Masjids for the poor communities of Pakistan.

This year alone, the charity has built 55 Masjids allowing thousands of poor students and daily worshiper to address their spiritual suffering, **Alhamdulillah**.

To impart the true message of Qur'an and allow the upcoming generations, **Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak)** initiated a faith-based intervention in form of **Hifdh Sponsorship** where the enrolled Hifdh students and their respective teachers are quarterly reimbursed.

Much-needed spiritual nourishment for the children of Ummah and reasonable delivery of financial support for poverty ridden families are the key aims of the Hifdh Sponsorship project.

Each teacher sponsored under the project receives a monthly payment of PKR 17,000 for the teaching services he/she provides to the children at their respective Hifdh classes where each Hifdh student receives (£10 per month) allowing him/her to memorize the Qur'an and provide some financial support to his/her families as well.

Teacher Sponsorship

For developing a child with enough knowledge of Islam and its teachings, Islamic Teachers are here to play a critical role to help the child to learn the instructions for improving his/her spiritual well-being.

Teacher Sponsorship is a unique faith-based intervention under the Umbrella of wide range DAWAH projects implemented by UWT (Pak).

Under the project, teachers who provide his/her full-time teaching services at their respective classes are quarterly reimbursed (**PKR 8,000 per month**) for their efforts as they are allowing children of Muslim Ummah to have access to free-of-cost and high-quality Islamic education.

Qur'an Distribution

In Islam, the 2nd most followed religion in the world after Christianity, the Holy Qur'an is the beating heart of Islam which was revealed by Allah (S.W.T) on the Messenger Muhammad (S.A.W) to help people navigate their lives accordingly for eternal success.

As Allah's word, the status of the Holy Qur'an is unrivalled and for this reason Muslims from the dawn of Islam have striven to preserve its authenticity.

In the past year, Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) has distributed over **14,200** copies of the Holy Qur'an to the students and teachers allowing them to learn their lessons and recite it on regular basis.

Islamic Books Distribution

Going a step further, the DAWAH interventions of Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) also covers provision of Islamic Textbooks to the students who are studying in Madaris & Makatib but they are likely to lack quality instructional materials in form of books as per the existing syllabus to continue their Islamic education.

Students studying in rural and hard-to-reach parts of Pakistan and are provided with Islamic Textbooks for allowing them to learn their daily lessons and prepare themselves for their examination as well.

CARING FOR THE LIFE

Dialysis Center

Half the world lacks access to essential health services as 100 million still pushed into extreme poverty because of health expenses as each year, large numbers of households are being pushed into poverty because they must pay for health-care out of their own pockets.

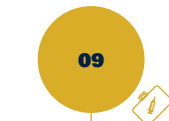
In Pakistan, the already overstretched health system faces a critical shortage of key ingredients – qualified health-care workers, safe and equipped facilities, and supplies of medicines, equipment and vaccine which is compromising the health-related outcomes for major portion of the population.

UWT (Pak) focuses specifically on ensuring healthy lives and promoting well-being for all at all ages by ensuring access to quality essential health-care services and access to safe, effective, quality and affordable essential medical-care and medicines.

At **Ummah Dialysis Centre**, equipped with 09 state-of-the-art dialysis machines and staffed with 08 employees, 468 dialysis sessions are performed every month.

As regular dialysis sessions allow an individual to continue to live though their kidneys no longer work adequately where a prolonged lack of dialysis session can ultimately result in death.

Alhamdulillah, since June, 2009 through life saving intervention in form of **Ummah Dialysis Centre** at Swabi, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, UWT (Pak) is providing free dialysis sessions to poor kidney patients of district Swabi and surrounding areas.

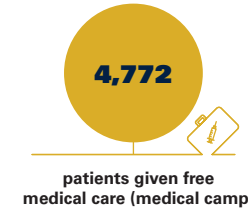

Medical Camps

Under the Medical Camp project, Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) established Medical Camps in Pakistan providing essential health-care services to the visiting patients where free-of-cost medicines, medical consumables were available at the camps which was supervised by highly qualified medical team.



DROP OF LIFE

Water Supply Project

'The best charity (Sadaqah) is giving water (to drink).'

Access to clean water is a basic human right as people cannot enjoy a stable, healthy, and decent life without water.

Availability, physical accessibility, equitable affordability and safe and cultural acceptability is required for the fulfilment of this human right.

Making water available, accessible, affordable and culturally acceptable for the poor communities of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab and Sindh regions of Pakistan,

Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) remained committed over the years by implementing water solutions projects by installing hand pumps.

Alhamdulillah, 2019, the charity has installed and handed over 1,425 hand pumps in poor communities across Pakistan allowing benefitted communities to have access to clean and sustainable and improved water source prevented from any type of contamination for their domestic consumption.

Filtration Plant

Resilient infrastructure/long-term solutions may positively impact (wellbeing, economic prospects, quality of life) of the ordinary people life particularly in developing countries like Pakistan as infrastructure disruptions are an everyday concern.

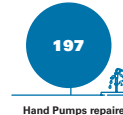
Absence of resilient infrastructure/long-term solutions may reduce employment opportunities, hampering both health and education outcomes and limiting economic growth.

Millions of people across Pakistan are consuming contaminated water on daily basis due to damaged or unprotected water infrastructure as recurring natural disasters are posing a great threat to these infrastructures resulting waterborne diseases which ultimately force the consumer to spend their hard earned earning on their health.

To find a permanent solution, UWT (Pak) Water Filtration Plants 03 are effectively ending the daily long walk, and saving physically demanding hours used for water collection for different local communities of Punjab province of Pakistan.

Wells Maintenance

The communities where UWT (Pak) had installed water wells under the **Water Supply project** been experiencing chronic water shortages, due to their reliance on the damaged water wells even with a minor repair requirement.

UWT (Pak) **Wells Maintenance** project had allowed those communities to have an improved access to clean water after the required repair been carried out by the project teams.

During the year-2019 under the project, 197 existing wells with minor repair been re-operationalized which had increased the water supply and alleviated pressure on the existing infrastructure.

The repaired wells will work constantly to supply clean water to the local residents relying on these wells for their daily subsistence.

The project focuses on local capacity building and the rehabilitation of infrastructure to reduce water-related diseases by allowing communities to enjoy the benefits of clean water.

IFTAR FOR THE UMMAH Ramadhan

For Muslims across the world, Ramadhan is the most sacred month of the Islamic calendar as they fast for an entire day: they begin fasting at the Fajr call to prayer just before dawn and break their fast at sunset.

This is not the case for thousands of Muslims families as for impoverished families this period of never-ending blessings turns into a constant struggle as they are unable to feed their fasting families with their limited purchasing power ultimately affecting their daily worship.

Alhamdulillah, Through Ramadhan Food project, This year, UWT (Pak) remembered the fasting Muslim brothers and sisters during the blessed month of Ramadhan across Pakistan by providing them with carefully designed IFTAR Packs (each pack included rice, sugar, cooking oil, pulses & other items) where the provided packs reduced their food-insecurity and allowed them to worship Allah (S.W.T)

FOLLOWING THE SUNNAH Qurbani

Eid-ul-Adha, or the festival of Sacrifice is annually celebrated by the Muslims across the world marking the end of Hajj pilgrimage to Makkah, and in commemoration of Prophet Ibrahim (A.S) readiness to sacrifice his son Ismail (A.S) to show obedience to Allah (S.W.T).

For the challenging task of performing the Qurbani on behalf of thousands of donors, animals were purchased, kept in care, then sacrificed and the fresh meat was effectively transported and distributed within three days across Pakistan.

This year, Under the Annual Qurbani project, UWT (Pak) was able to sacrifice thousands of animals (cows, bulls, sheep, goats) on behalf of the donors on the blessed days of Eid-ul-Adha where the meat was distributed among hundreds of thousands impoverished Muslims families allowing them to have meat in their meals on the blessed occasion of Eid-ul-Adha.

Under Aqeeqah/Animal Sacrifice project, healthy cows, goats & sheep were sacrificed at Ummah Children Academy on behalf of respective donors and the produced meat was served at UCA and also delivered to other Madaris and Makatib of district Nowshera, Mardan, Swabi, Charsadda, Peshawar and other areas.

For many children from marginalized and economically disadvantaged communities, the Eid day remain as ordinary as any other day of the week but with UWT (Pak) unique Eid Gifts Destruction project, for hundreds of thousands children this ordinary day is turned into a special occasion where they can have new clothes, shoes and toys as like other children from affluent families.

This year on the Occasion of Eid-ul-Fitr and Eid-ul-Adha, children from several communities inside Pakistan were allowed to wear new clothes and shoes and play with their toys after they received Eid Gifts at UWT (Pak) Eid Gifts distributions.

Poor, orphaned, disabled and needy children had been emotionally assisted to celebrate the Islamic festivities Eid-ul-Fitr & Eid-ul-Adha as like other affluent children of the society.

RESPONDING TO HUNGER

Sadaqat-ul-fitr

"The most beloved deed in the sight of Allah after the compulsory acts is bringing happiness to a Muslim." [Tabrani]

Sadaqat-ul-Fitr (also called Zakat-ul-Fitr) is an obligatory charity for every Muslim who possesses the Nisab (a minimum amount of wealth); it must be paid before the Eid-ul-Fitr (i.e. before the end of Ramadhan).

This year, UWT (Pak) had effectively supported the food insecure families on the auspicious occasion of Eid-ul-Fitr by distributing Sadaqatul Fitr (Wheat Flour Bag) for strengthening the existing food security status of benefitted families across Pakistan for a reasonable period of time. Vital food-based assistance for addressing the nutrition-related deficiencies was distributed by the charity.

A NEW START

New Livelihoods

"No one earns his food better than the one who worked with his hands, and the Prophet of Allah, Dawud (alayhissalaam), earned his food by working with his hands." [Sunan Abi Dawud]

Graduation into sustainable livelihoods refers to households leading economically viable livelihoods that increase their incomes, make them food secure throughout the year, and allows them to access basic needs like seek schooling and health-care facilities, and generally get them beyond the poverty line on long-term basis.

With limited livelihoods opportunities, people have limited choice to buy better foods, pay for schooling, get quality health-care, and invest and earn more money for their families for restoring their lost dignity and self-respect.

Alhamdulillah, over the years through a comprehensive strategy of helping the poorest on a pathway out of extreme poverty, UWT (Pak) had implemented **New Livelihoods** projects, by providing **Donkey Cart, Auto-Rickshaws, Sewing Machine, Loaders, Livestock Distribution, Poultry Distribution, Retail/Vegetables Shops Establishment** and many others.

UWT (Pak) had provided Auto-Rickshaws to poor unemployed persons with key aim of helping the struggling but determined breadwinners from lower-income communities across Pakistan to start their livelihoods and support their economically challenged families where the likelihood of slipping back significantly decreases after these interventions.

After graduating from the centre, the female students also have confidence, knowledge, skills and linkages that allow them to continue and sustain upward mobility with improve food security, access to quality education, availing better health-care services and improving their dignity and wellbeing.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Community Support

From the most beloved deeds of Allah is to make a believer happy and remove a grief from him, or to repay his debt, or to satisfy his hunger. [Bayhaqi]

The umbrella of Community Support interventions covers a widespread approach of addressing growing needs of communities by large not individually.

This year, under Community Support interventions, Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) had implemented range of projects from in-kind support to cash assistance and from spiritual well-being to breaking the chain of slavery for communities across several regions of Pakistan.

The desired assistance to the targeted communities was delivered through this project as bondage was ended for Hindus inside interior Sindh, cash-based assistance was made available for economically challenged families of Pakistan and spiritual nourishment was ensured for blind people.

Hardship Cases

Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) delivered vital cash-based assistance in form of Hardship Cases allowing chronically ill people to pay for their much-needed treatment for their immediate health recovery.

The project had resulted positive impacts on the financially vulnerable families of Pakistan as they were allowed to pay for their basic needs with ease and comfort for a reasonable period of time.

Under the New Muslim Sponsorship project, newly converted 220 children in interior Sindh, Pakistan been reimbursed (£45 each) on quarterly basis to continue their education (modern | Islamic). Over the years, the faith-based project had delivered vital cash/faith-based assistance to the sponsored New Muslim children and their disadvantaged families as well where there are children who was bonded even before their birth.
