## UMMAH CHILDREN ACADEMY

In the year 2007, Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) initiated a unique intervention in form of Ummah Children Academy, a state-of-the-art educational facility located at main G.T road, Soria Khel, Nowshera to allow orphans children from the community to have access to free-of-cost quality-education (Modern | Islamic), boarding, food, medical-care and recreational services.

The key aim of Ummah Children Academy is to support education for the marginalized orphan children as this educational intervention is contributing to increase the literacy rate, improving education facilities, and creating generations capable of participating in the development of their families, communities and their country.

Orphan Students graduated from the academy are now perusing their higher degrees in renowned educational institutes of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa as well as Pakistan for securing a better future.

### UMMAH CHILDREN ACADEMY WANA

To go further deep, an academy was established in 2010 at Wana, South Waziristan where currently 580 orphan students from one of the least developed and conflict-affected region of Pakistan have access to quality education in their domestic area.

## UMMAH CENTER FOR THE DISABLE

Ummah Center for the Disabled has been providing educational and rehabilitation services to the enrolled students from 2009.

The disability-inclusive intervention is currently allowing 64 most-deserving children with special needs from district Rawalpindi and others areas to complete their special education and rehabilitation with a hope for a bright future and an opportunity to pursue their dreams.

Students at the center include those who have long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments which in interaction with various barriers may hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others.

## UMMAH COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY

For young people, the path to a successful future goes through quality technical education that equips them and empowers them with the skill set they need to thrive in today's workforce.

Young people are some of the world's best creative, enthusiasts and thinkers and if they are carefully used their energy and ideas can help them contribute to their economies and societies.

To allow orphan children to have access to free-of-cost technical education, Ummah College of Technology was established in 2015 where the college is currently offering various technologies courses (Diploma of Associate Engineering) including civil, electrical, mechanical along with short courses surveying, draftsman and CAD, electrician and carpentry etc. as well as one-year diploma in Information Technology inside a single building with highly qualified teaching staff & well-equipped laboratories and workshops.

The solutions-oriented initiative in form of technical college is targeting vocational training in line with the local market demand as the enrolled students are completing their technical education and training for acquiring market-oriented skill-sets for a better future and earning a dignified living for their families.

## DIALYSIS CENTER

The WHO defines quality of care as "the extent to which health-care services provided to individuals and patient populations for improving desired health outcomes, to achieve this, health-care must be safe, effective, timely, efficient, equitable and people-centered.

In 2009, UWT (Pak) initiated Ummah Dialysis Centre in district Swabi, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, that continues to be the only free, specialist structure in the area providing treatment services to the needy kidney patients.

At Ummah Dialysis Centre, many kidney patients arrive from rural areas of district Swabi and other bordering districts but they are often illiterate and attracted primarily by the lack of cost, long distance and unavailability of dialysis treatment services in their domestic areas.

Ummah Dialysis Centre, equipped with 08 state-of-the-art dialysis machine and staffed with 08 employees is now able to deliver 360 dialysis session per month where the patients specifically chosen Ummah Dialysis Centre for the quality of its treatment and services.

Alhamdulillah, through life saving intervention in form of Ummah Dialysis Centre at Bam Khel, Swabi, UWT (Pak) is providing free dialysis sessions to poor kidney patients of district Swabi and surrounding areas on regular basis.

# PROPAGATING THE QURAN

## HIFDH SPONSORSHIP

Under the annual DAWAH project, UWT (Pak) Hifdh Sponsorship project was implemented with the key aim of allowing the young students of Muslim Ummah to memorize the Qur'an and become future teachers of Islam and carriers of the truth.

Alongside spiritual support, the project also provides economic support to the registered Hifdh Teachers and their families as well as deliver some financial relief to the families of Hifdh students.

The Hifdh Sponsorship incentives from UWT (Pak) offer sponsored Hifdh Teachers a monthly payment of PKR 17,000 so that the sponsored Hifdh Teachers can continue teaching and help more children to memorize the Qur'an where the Hifdh students receive (£10 per month) allowing them to memorize the Qur'an and provide some financial support to their families as well.

80 Hifdh Teachers (male-76 | female-04) and 1,600 students (boys-1,503 | girls-97) around 80 classes across 03 regions of Pakistan (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa-68, Punjab-10 and Sindh-02) were reimbursed on quarterly basis.

## TEACHER SPONSORSHIP

Islamic Teachers play a critical role to help children learn the instructions of Islam where teachers are vital to reach education goals for all children and equip them to improve their spiritual well-being and thrive.

UWT (Pak) Teacher Sponsorship project aims to allow children living in 471 poor communities to access free Islamic education.

By supporting qualified Islamic Teachers in form of monthly reimbursement (PKR 8,000) for their efforts, the project is a hope to engender free high-quality Islamic education from committed teachers for poor rural children inside some of the hard-to-reach areas of Pakistan.

471 Islamic Teachers (425-male | 46-female) providing their vital services including 410 in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, 46 in Punjab, 08 in Sindh alongside 07 in other regions are reimbursed on quarterly basis (PKR 24,000).

Alhamdulillah, for young children in 29 regions, access to free and quality Islamic education is no more a dream but a reality.





# LONELY ORPHANS

In the recent decades, the number of orphans and widows in disaster-prone Pakistan has steadily grown as wars, displacement and natural disasters escalate. Sadly, growing indifference towards this vulnerable segment of society, their needs are increasingly not being met.

UWT (Pak) systematically raised its specific, individual child Orphan Sponsorship Program where nothing is now more vital than access to education for the most-neglected segment of our society.

Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) helped 1,300 registered orphans where direct personal sponsorship were provided to 992 orphans in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, 140 in Sindh, 63 in Baluchistan, 61 in Punjab and 44 in earthquake affected areas of Pakistan.

Through the completed project, 816 boys and 484 girls orphans were allowed to continue their education for a better future for themselves and their marginalized families.

## A HAND FOR THE WEAK

### NEEDY WIDOWS

Across the disaster-prone and conflict affected Pakistan, single and widowed mothers are the worst affected in the wake of disasters and post-disaster situation.

With no breadwinners or assets, many are often reduced to begging or compromising their honor so that their children can survive.

For these widows where many of them cannot work due to cultural restrictions, age-factor, cash assistance is an excellent way to protect these marginalized mothers and sisters of our society.

To support this segment of the society, UWT (Pak) Widows Sponsorship project is effectively alleviating the difficulties of sponsored widows of Pakistan by providing financial aid with the help of your kind donations where each sponsored widow receives £30 per month to cover basic essentials of her family.

This year, 360 widows from 19 districts of Pakistan were reimbursed to support their financially insecure families in a dignified manner.

## FOOD AID PAKISTAN

For further expanding the provision of support to the food insecure families and Islamic Institutes propagating the message of Islam, 157.50 tons of food supplies under Food Aid project was distributed allowing the beneficiaries to have access to a nutritionally enriched diet for a reasonable period of time in the face of COVID-19 pandemic (a multifaceted crisis confronting the already impoverished families in developing countries).

Alhamdulillah, the project covered areas like Nowshera, Mardan, Charsadda, Swabi, Peshawar, Abbottabad, Shangla, Bajaur in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Rawalpindi, Attock, Islamabad in Punjab and Umar Kot in Sindh region of Pakistan where 3,500 food packs were distributed effectively.

Alongside financial support to 05 widows and shelter relief to 05 shelter-less families, 48 female with tailoring skills were provided with Sewing Machines to generate income for their families and address the immediate needs of their families with ease and dignity on long-term basis.

Distributions took place across the project territories, with hundreds of needy families received their Iftar packs.

The work continued during the blessed month of Ramadhan allowing food insecure families to have the required access to nutritionally enriched diet.

## OFFERING YOUR SACRIFICES

In the noble days of Dhul Hijjah, this year 2020 Ummah Welfare Trust sacrificed almost 4,159 (small/large) animals. Totalling almost PKR 163.82 million in value, animal were sacrificed in Pakistan and their meat distributed to hundreds of thousands poor Muslims of Pakistan, **Alhamdulillah.**

The blessings of Eid ul Adha reached the poor, displaced and the orphaned where many recipients hadn't eaten meat all year until your sacrificial animals arrived.

May Allah (S.W.T) accept it from the donors who donated their Qurbani for the brothers & sisters of Pakistan.

Aqeeqah is a Prophetic tradition, a gesture of gratitude for the gift of life, and empathy with the food-deprived. 1,229 Aqeeqah sacrifices were made on behalf of the donors' newborn babies — God protect and light their paths.

Through Aqeeqah, shares of fresh meat reached orphan students of Ummah Children Academy and thousands of students studying in Islamic institutes in Nowshera, Mardan, Swabi, Peshawar, Charsadda, Rawalpindi & Islamabad where all the beneficiaries sent heartfelt prayers for precious newborns, **Alhamdulillah.**

## CREATING INDEPENDENCE

### TRAINING CENTER

*Empowering vulnerable girls and women to gain stability and self-reliance.*

Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) offers Islamic Education and Vocational Training to female students, most of whom are poor and orphaned girls. The program is housed in Shams Colony, Rawalpindi in the Punjab region of Pakistan.

The enrolled students are coached in crafts such as sewing, embroidery; then given certificates which allow them to launch their own start-ups.

After building a clientele and generating income, the graduated students of Ummah Islamic Education & Vocational Center give back by helping to train the next cohort of beneficiaries in their areas of residence.

In addition to these specialized occupational skills, the students are able to learn the basic of Islam for addressing their much-needed spiritual needs.

## BUILDING MASJIDS

The masjid plays the greatest role in the well-being of the Muslim Ummah as it is the main link between the masses and their Lord. It is also Islam's most evident symbol and the most salient characteristic of a Muslim community.

As part of its goal to increase their number, Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) has built 16 masjids (02-Large | 14-Small) in the past year. Masjids have been built in remote villages in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh, Pakistan, Alhamdulillah.

More Muslims are today able to offer their prayers in congregation and more children are able to learn their religion after school, thanks to the donations from the donors and efforts of Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak).

## PROVIDING SAFE WATER

The price paid by poor communities with no access to clean water is huge. Wasted income, lost time and ill- health all have a devastating impact on families. Children in particular suffer, with water-borne diseases being one of the biggest killer worldwide.

Tackling the shortages of clean water across the rural parts of Pakistan remains a big challenge. Nevertheless, Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) remains committed to it, drilling and installing hundreds of hand pumps in Pakistan through the past year.

During the year, 243 large and 190 small water wells been constructed in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh region of Pakistan.

The accessible water through UWT (Pak) Water Supply project has improved thousands of lives, bringing convenience, safety and privacy for hundreds of communities with long-term benefits.

# BRINGING WARMTH

## WINTER AID

Since the beginning of 2020, there have been successive humanitarian crises that weighed heavily on the victims of existing disasters and conflicts and added to them thousands, or even millions, of new victims affected by the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, flash floods and other emergencies that displaced households, damaged homes and facilities, and destroyed livelihoods.

For the vulnerable and the distressed, the winter is equivalent to suffering and hardship, particularly children, women, patients, and older persons as they are desperate for the winterization aid provided every year by UWT under its annual Warm Winter campaign.

As like previous years, as winter temperatures set in, accompanied by winds and rain, Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) in Pakistan has completed the distribution of 2,315 winter kits consisting of blankets, shoes, warm clothes and other essential items.

The distributed winter kits will meet the most-urgent needs of less protected students of 85 Islamic Institutes across 09 districts in 03 regions of Pakistan including Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab and Sindh.

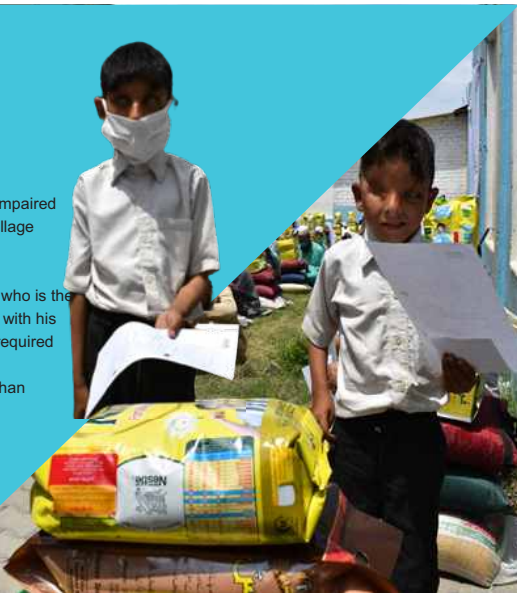




## THE DIET OF THEIR CHOICE

Unfortunately, Faizan & Sulaiman are both visually impaired brothers by birth who live with their family of 5 in village Sawkai, tehsil & district Mardan in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province of Pakistan. Their father, Iqbal Hussain is a daily wages labourer who is the only available source of income for their family but with his limited income he is unable to pay for any type of required treatment of his both visually impaired children. Faizan & Sulaiman feelings after receiving Ramadhan Food Pack, "Thank you Ummah Welfare Trust for your generous support as the provided Ramadhan Food Packs will decrease our father's worries for a reasonable period of time regarding our food-related needs."



## NUTRITIONAL SUPPORT

For Jamal Uddin who is a newly converted Muslim (October 2020 along with his wife) it was a daily practice to be deprived from his right of living freely and forced to live under high risk and life-threatening conditions (bonded labour). Fortunately, in October 2020, life took a sharp but good turn for Jamal Uddin as he was able to find the right way of life by converting to Islam from Hinduism. "The food-based assistance provided by Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) was very important and timely for us as it will allow me to feed my family, and take care of them," says Jamal Uddin who lives with his newly converted wife and two young children.



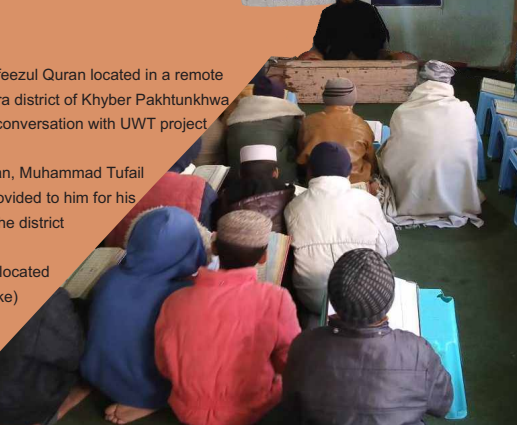

## ACCESS TO FINANCIAL SUPPORT

### Teacher Sponsorship, Mansehra, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

From last several years I am a teacher in Jamia Tahfeezul Quran located in a remote village (Shelahi post office Mahandri) in the Mansehra district of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province of Pakistan," said Muhammad Tufail in his conversation with UWT project team. Under UWT Teacher Sponsorship Project for Pakistan, Muhammad Tufail was registered in 2013 where quarterly stipend is provided to him for his teaching services at Madrasas Tahfeezul Quran, in the district Mansehra. "34 local children are currently enrolled at my class (located in one of the worst affected district in 2005 earthquake) learning the Holy Quran and other basic instructions of Islam, this all was possible with support of Ummah Welfare Trust."



## ACCESS TO FREE DIALYSIS

### Ummah Dialysis Center, Swabi, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa

Salma Bibi, is a young-age dialysis patient who is suffering from chronic kidney disease from last five years, living with her family of 06 in the district of Swabi. Her husband, Saeed Khan has a small shop from where he hardly earns PKR 10-12 thousand monthly where most of his earning is spent on his family basic needs. Salma Bibi is accessing free-of-cost dialysis sessions twice-a-week at Ummah Dialysis Centre, Bam Khel, Swabi where her single dialysis ensure that she lives a better life with no daily health restrictions.
