Persistent economic shocks, climate extremes and soaring commodities prices combined to create a crisis of unprecedented proportions for millions of poor households in Pakistan as these impoverished families with limited resources were unsure of where their next meal is coming from.

Following one of the country's most devastating natural disasters (Flood-2022), unmet needs heighten the risk of long-term marginalization where loss of lives and the reversal of hard-earned development gains was the price paid largely by some of the most-vulnerable.

Ummah Welfare Trust's work in 2022, when increasing climate shocks and the continued ripple effects of the COVID-19 pandemic combined sent hundreds of thousands of families below the poverty line provided lifesaving and life-changing support through Educational Support, Social Protection, Health-Care, WASH, Community Support, Emergency Relief and many more interventions to end suffering and to help build more peaceful and prosperous societies, Alhamdulillah.

Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) has continued its struggle to bring some comfort to the families with orphans, widows, people with disabilities and poor people across regions of Pakistan who were suffering due to conflicts and disasters.

Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) has focused on helping the most-vulnerable across the project regions by reaching distant villages and helping those who have no prospect of earning, such as the people with disabilities, female headed households and families relying on orphan children for their survival.

We would like to express our gratitude to the committed volunteers and dedicated staff, who have made it possible by working day and night to deliver the amanah of donors in the best way to the intended beneficiaries.

THE DELUSIONS OF WEALTH

Shaytan has deceived many of us today into a self-centred lifestyle. We think happiness lies in consumption, gratification and being aloof from those around us.

Like Fira'wn's advisor, Qaroon, before us, we are intoxicated by comforts and materialism. And like him, we have become conceited with it, saying, 'I was given it due to my knowledge!' (28:78)

We believe this wealth is ours, and so we do everything we can to protect it, cherish it and expand it. On occasion, we sprinkle a little in charity's way, like a man clearing dirt from under his fingernails.

However, the ways of our beloved Messenger of Allah Sallallahu 'alayhi wasallam and his Companions were different. He once said:

‘The son of Adam boasts: My wealth! My wealth! O son of Adam, have you truly earned any wealth but what you ate and consumed, or put on and wore out, or spent in charity so it remained (with Allah in reward)?’

The Companions RadhyAllahu 'anhum knew that happiness lay in faith followed by action, in suppressing desires, in sacrificing for Allah, and in preferring others over themselves. Happiness was in choosing the everlasting over that which perishes and vanishes.

When night would fall, the Messenger of Allah's wealthier companions would take the people of As-Suffah to their homes and feed them. Some companions would take one, others two or three, and some up to nine and ten. The eminent Ansari, Sa'ad ibn 'Ubadah RadhyAllahu' anh would take up to eighty people home every day and feed them.

Unlike us, the Sahabah were not enamoured by their wealth. They knew its purpose, its reward and, more pertinently, its tribulations.

May Allah allow us to follow the likes of Sa'ad, and continue nourishing the Ummah with that which Allah has given us.

TRANSFORMING FUTURES

Alhamdulillah, at Ummah Children Academy, hundreds of orphaned children completed yet another schooling year under Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) annual Educational Support intervention.

At the academy, these vulnerable orphans are protected from the threats they would otherwise to face like hazardous child labor, child begging, child trafficking etc.

UWT (Pak) remains committed to support orphans at academy until they grow up and are capable to care for themselves and meet all their needs ranging from shelter to health-care, education to food.

Orphans enrolled at the academy live in a family like environment as they remain connected to their homelands, live in their own cultural environment close to their relatives and without being dependent on others for their care.

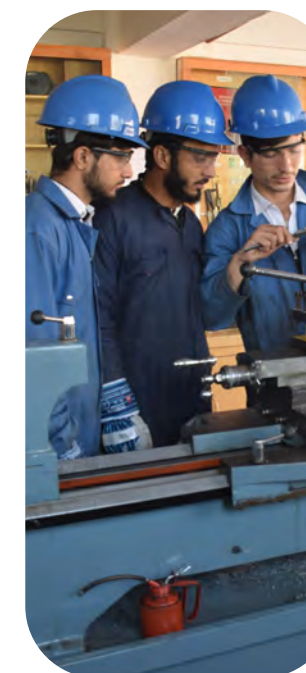


UMMAH COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY

The loss of caregivers can have a detrimental impact on the development of a child and can put him/her at greater risk of neglect, violence and exploitation particularly those from low-income families.

Orphaned students at Ummah College of Technology, Nowshera (a technical education intervention of UWT-Pak) are lucky enough to bridge the widening educational gap through access to free-of-cost technical education opportunities.

The college is allowing orphaned students to acquire different market-oriented skills to access available job opportunities for earning a dignified living.

UMMAH CENTRE FOR THE DISABLE

Children with specific needs are often being pushed deeper into poverty and further out of sight, by the compounding effects of social exclusion, and inequality.

For the children with specific needs at Ummah Centre for the Disabled, it is not the case as they have found a safe place where they can learn and rehabilitate in a family like environment.

At the center through specialized care, the enrolled students with specific needs are showing positive improvement as they are gradually gaining back their lost autonomy which will ultimately end their dependency on their immediate caregivers.

...AND HER ORPHANED CHILDREN

The devastating loss of a partner is magnified for many women around the world by a long-term fight for the realization of their basic rights and dignity.

This is a daily story for more than 258 million widows around the world who have been left unseen, unsupported, and unmeasured in the societies.

For financially vulnerable widows the death of their spouse brings grief, loss and trauma as they have to face economic insecurity, discrimination, stigmatization, and harmful traditional practices.

Alhamdulillah, through Widows Sponsorship project, 710 widowed mothers & sisters were allowed to have required financial relief for reducing their dependency on their families and relatives.

As 1 in 4 of the world's school-age children - more than 500 million - lives in countries affected by humanitarian crises such as conflicts, natural disasters and disease outbreaks where the future of orphans is always at stake after losing their breadwinners make them unable to continue their education.

UWT Pak orphan sponsorship program provides orphaned students a strong foundation for future learning and addressing their learning poverty effectively where the program has allowed 1750 orphaned children to be at their schools as they can easily pay for their schooling after receiving stipends during 2022.

Through quarterly stipends disbursement orphaned children's self-confidence in the wake of hardships that dominate their academic education process been effectively restored.

UWT (Pak) built Houses of Allah for ensuring that communities are allowed to offer their congregational prayers five-times-a-day and their next generation can learn and practice the faith as it deserves to be.

Alhamdulillah, over the years, the charity has built hundreds of Masjids for communities of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab and Sindh region of Pakistan where the constructed Masjids had ensured that the communal obligations of Islam are upheld.

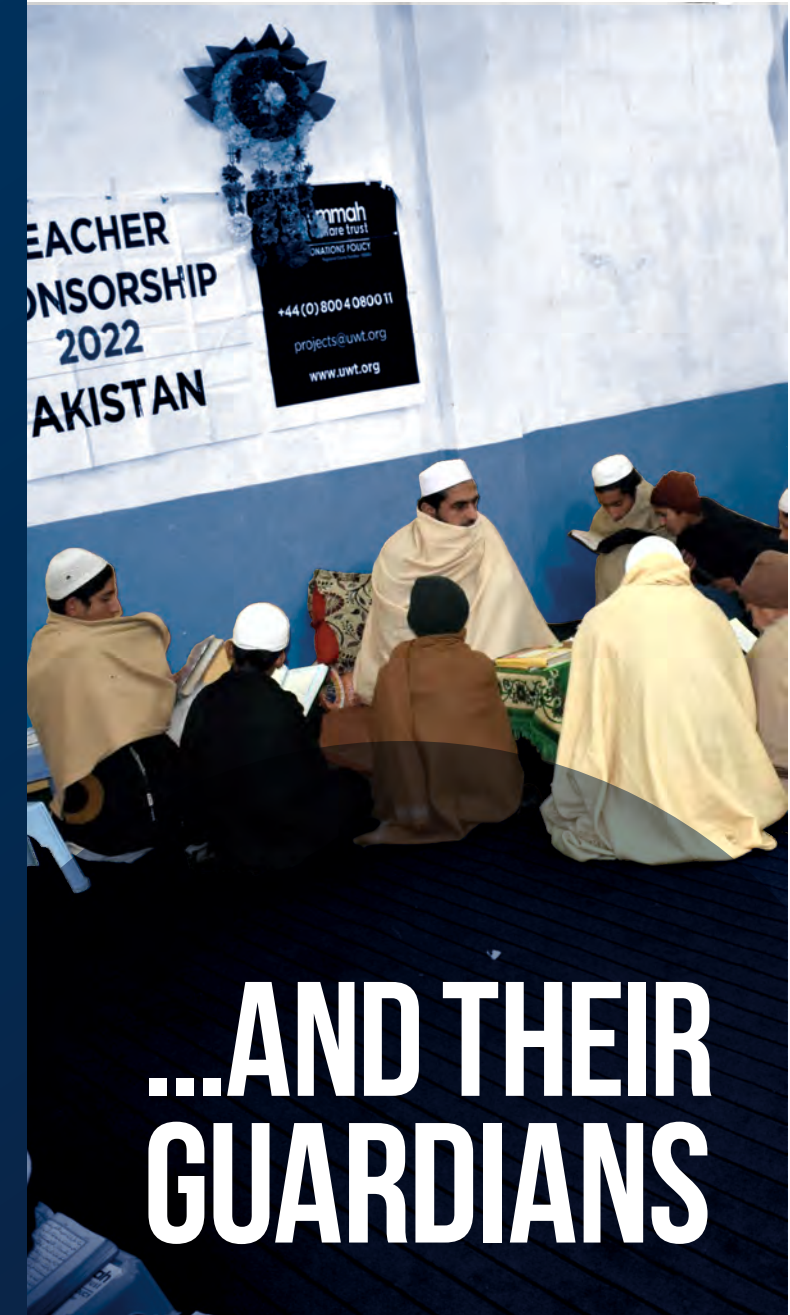

The annual Cataract Surgeries project aimed at examining poor eye-patients for diagnosing the cases, and referring them for surgical interventions.

The project is part of charity's Health-Care interventions to alleviate the suffering of vulnerable people and support the health of struggling eye-patients, by treating common eye diseases such as cataract with medical examinations, referrals, surgeries, and medication.

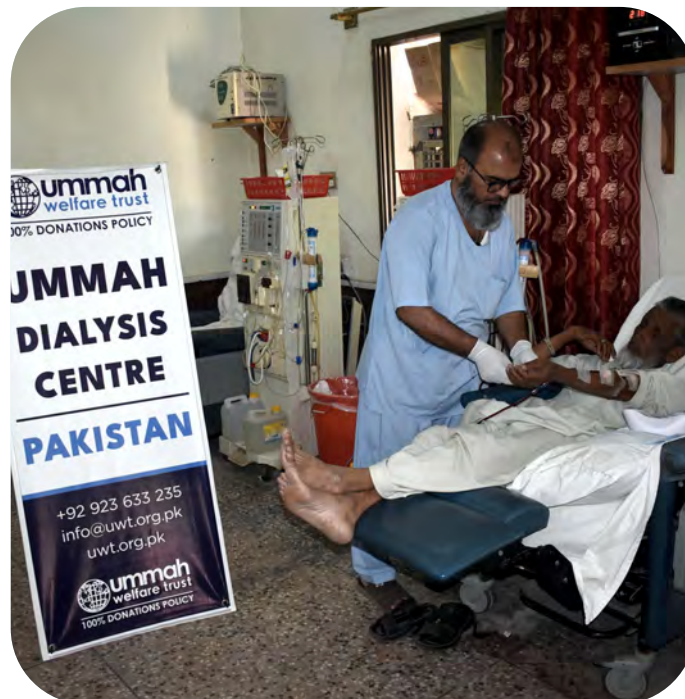

Once diagnosed with end stage renal disease, kidney patients can expect to continue lifelong dialysis treatment where they are required to undergo three- to four-hour-long hemodialysis sessions three times-a-week.

The dedicated medical team at Ummah Dialysis Centre carries out approximately 360 dialysis sessions on monthly basis where medical services are free of charge for all the patients.

This life-saving contribution illustrates the commitment of Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) to support and strengthen the health sector on long-term basis for treating the poor kidney patients.

The project aimed at enhancing the capacity at the Dialysis Centre to carry out life-saving dialysis sessions for easing the pressure on public health sector.

WATER WELL

Water is the source of life but unfortunately, water scarcity and insecurity are an everyday reality for over 385 million children and their families in South Asia where these children suffer detrimental and sometimes irreversible effects on their health, development, education and security due to the persistent acute shortage of water.

Pakistan is among the world top 10 countries with water stress where access to this precious resource been made harder by conflicts, recurring natural disasters (floods and droughts), deteriorated water infrastructure and depleting fresh water reserves.

The burden of collecting water with a long water walk is on women and children who traditionally collect water from unsafe water points to allow their families to address their water-related needs.

Every well dug, every drink of clean water a child took, every bucket filled by a woman – these are steps towards a better, more prosperous future with safe and sustainable water availability ensured through Ummah Welfare Trust (Pak) **1,665** water well during 2022, Alhamdulillah.

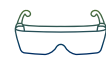

WATER WELL MAINTENANCE

Installations of water infrastructure and its maintenance is a costly affair that many, including governments, struggle to afford which force the local community to consume water for contaminated water points with negative impacts on their health.

Alongside constructing new water wells, the charity is regularly repairing the previously installed water wells, allowing the benefitted communities to address their water-related needs, uninterruptedly.

Through this project, access to safe and affordable water is ensured as the constructed water wells are managed professionally through minor repairs with long-term clean water availability.

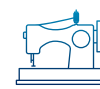
HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE
